




The Sermon - The Law

In such a way the law is just like a beater who drives the hungry to Christ so that Christ might fill them with his good things. Therefore the proper office of the law is to make us guilty, humble us, kill us, bring us to hell and take everything away from us; but for the purpose that in this way we become righteous, are saved, are made alive, are brought to heaven and obtain everything. The Sermon - The Gospel

Everything that comforts, that offers God's favor and grace to transgressors of the Law, is, and is properly called, the Gospel. It is a good and joyful message that God will not punish sins, but will forgive them for Christ's sake.

Formula of Concord, Solid Declaration, Article V

But the Gospel is properly the kind of teaching that shows what a person who has not kept the Law (and therefore is condemned by it) is to believe. It teaches that Christ has paid for and made satisfaction for all sins [Romans 5:9]. Christ has gained and acquired for an individual—without any of his own merit—forgiveness of sins, righteousness that avails before God, and eternal life [Romans 5:10].

The proper distinction between Law and Gospel is the highest and most difficult art.



The Sermon - The Challenge

This distinction between law and gospel is the highest art in Christendom, and whoever claims or takes for himself the name Christian should understand and know it. For where something is lacking at this point of doctrine, there one cannot tell a Christian from a pagan or a Jew, so much depends on this distinction . . . there neither law nor gospel can be understood and consciences must be lost in blindness and error . . . Therefore no one can mix the two together or mistake one for the other without falsifying doctrine. . . . Therefore whoever knows the art of distinguishing law from gospel well, set him on top and name him a Doctor of Holy Scripture. For without the Holy Spirit it is impossible to arrive at this distinction. I experience for myself, and see daily in others, how hard it is to distinguish the doctrines of law and gospel from each other. Here the Holy Spirit must be master and teacher, or there would be no one on earth who could learn or teach. . . . For if the gospel is not clearly distinguished from the law, Christian doctrine cannot be kept free from error.

- Living the context
 - O What's the season or time of year?
 - O What's the theme of the day?
 - O What's the vibe?
- A text that connects with you and the people
- Living in the text
- Studying the text
- Researching the text
- Writing and memorizing

Thoughts on Sermon Preparation

- Questions to ponder about the text:
 - When were these words said/written?
 - O Why were they said/written?
 - O What was it like to be the author in that moment?
 - O What was it like to be the audience in that moment?
 - O What was the intended affect and effect?

Thoughts on Sermon Preparation

- Key textual questions:
 - O What is the very specific Law?
 - O What is the very specific Gospel?
 - What is the specific application of sanctification?
 - O What's the point?




Top Sermon Problems


- Same old, same old, <u>every single</u> <u>time</u>
- Generalized or generic Law . . . or . . . no Law
- Picking out pet sins and harping on them out of place
- Talking about the Gospel
- Trite Gospel
- Pulpit as a personality showcase
- ZERO heart
- No textual color

Watch Out!

- Opinio legis
 - O Do we minimize the role this plays in everything?
- Minimizing sin
 - O Do we assume people know their sin and its danger?
- Conditional gospel attaching an "if"
 - O Do we unintentionally attach conditions to the Gospel?
- Legalism
 - O Do we use the Law to elicit change without the Gospel?
- Moralism
 - o Do we use the Gospel to create only outward change?

Example Text: Luke 5:1-11

- 1 One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, the people were crowding around him and listening to the word of God. 2 He saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. 3 He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Self-Righteous Saints

Feel no need for the Law

- St. Augustine said that in preaching our goal is to:
 - Teach
 - Delight
 - Move
- Think of the great variety of scriptural styles!
 - Psalms, doxologies, parables, rhetoric, narratives, exhortations, and more!

 How important to find the balance between the 2-Fold working of the Word!

Psychological Working of the Word

God's Word touches:

- Emotion
- Intellect
- Will

Supernatural Working of the Word

God the Holy Spirit works through the Word when and where he will.

The efficacy of preaching doesn't depend on me!

WATCH OUT!


We dare not be careless preachers who forget God has sent and uses us.

- A wonderful summary to remember . . .
 - "We use 1st Article gifts to proclaim 2nd Article truths having 3rd Article confidence."

- Other reminders
 - o This is not dogmatics class!
 - O How clearly are you communicating?
 - O How much fluff is in your sermon?
 - o Paint pictures for the people!
 - o FOCUS and KEEP IT SIMPLE


- Made to Stick Messages:

Walk the Lutheran Middle with the Law

Antinomian Attitude

We are either sin-tolerant or we are such prodigals that we don't need the Law.

Legalistic Pride

We are Pharisees who are so righteous that we don't need the Law.

Advice from: *Preaching in a Postmodern World* class

Walk the Lutheran Middle with culture

Isolation from Culture

We ignore everything going on around us and stay in our bubble and our "Lutheran lane."

Compromise with Culture

We only talk about the culture, we preach more about the culture than Christ.

Advice from: *Preaching in a Postmodern World* class

- Things to consider in a Postmodern World
 - Your vocabulary
 - O Thinking about Worldview
 - Biblical illiteracy
 - The concept of identity
 - The value of community
 - Meaning/purpose in life
 - Emphasis and clarity on truth
 - O Be real / authentic
 - o Inductive thinking and sermons have value

Advice from: Liturgical Preaching class

- Are you and your sermon really that special?
- How do your hymns connect with your preaching?
- Do you ever connect elements of worship in preaching?
- Take them to the Font!
- Take them to the Altar!

Top Sermon Improvement Tips

- Take a class!
- Watch good preachers!
- Read! (Paustian, Deutschlander, and CS Lewis!)
- Soak up the Word in your heart and let it spill over
- Deliver with your personality throughout (not just in introductions)
- Deliver with passion
- Please memorize your sermon. Please.
- Don't let anyone guess if it was focused on Christ




